Guided Walking Holidays

With the emphasis on having fun our walking holidays are aimed at those who wish to enjoy relaxed walking, stopping to take in new sights and find out about the surroundings.

Our specially devised circular and linear walks allow us to tailor them to suit the ability and inclinations of most walkers. We consult with our guests daily to aim to get the right balance. The local terrain dictates some steep hill climbs on most walks but these can be taken at a comfortable pace with stops as often as required.

During the walks your guides will point out places of significance and lead you to places otherwise missed. Walking through the Marsland Nature Reserve and along the Heritage Coast, rare or unusual plants and wildlife can be sighted and identified.

Our walking holidays are very informal and can be made up of individuals, couples or groups. There is always plenty to do if you would prefer not to walk everyday. With arts and crafts courses available locally, you may like to try sculpture, painting, basket weaving, cheese making or many others. Some guests also like to take time out to visit some of the wonderful attractions the area has to offer, such as the RHS Gardens at Rosemoor or the Eden Project.

We aim to foster a convivial atmosphere throughout, as we believe the social aspects of walking are most important to make a truly unforgettable holiday.

Comfortable Hospitality

Situated just a few minutes walk from the Atlantic coast is the pretty farm hamlet of Mead where our walking base Home Farm is situated. Once popular with the 'Bloomsbury Group', the farmhouse has been visited by many famous artists over the years and with its huge inglenook fireplace is the perfect location to enjoy good food and unwind after walking.



Breakfast and dinner are served at the farmhouse where guests are also welcomed to socialise. Packed lunches are included on walking days and are made daily to order.

Accommodation is provided in cosy cottage apartments converted from the original stone barns of Mead just a step from the farmhouse. Rated 3 Star by the English Tourist Council, the apartments are fully equipped with lounge and kitchen so you can really feel at home. Having 2, 3 and 4 bedrooms some with en-suite facilities, we can accommodate groups of up to 20 people depending upon your preferences.

Also for our guests use is a games room with table tennis and pool table, outdoor tennis court and laundry.

Places To Delight You

Our programme varies depending upon the wishes of our guests and the weather and typically you can enjoy walks like these.

[Nature and Poets - Marsland Valley](#)

First out to Ronald Duncan's hut on the cliff dropping down to Marsland Beach then working back along the valley floor past Gooseham Mill and deeper into the Nature Reserve, climbing slowly back up to the village past the pottery and back to Home Farm.

[Wreckers Coast - Hartland Quay](#)

Down to Welcombe Mouth where the stream Strawberry Water cascades to the sea. A single climb takes us to the cliff top and on to the breathtaking waterfall at Spekes Mill Mouth. On then to Hartland Quay where a Pub awaits.

[Hawker's Country - Morwenstow](#)

Passing West Mill, we cross into Cornwall ascending Marsland Cliff with its view along the whole coastline. The coast path takes us through several valleys to the stunning church and vicarage at Morwenstow and on to the famous Hawkers Hut.

[Heritage Village - Clovelly](#)

From the ancient settlement at Brownsham we follow the coast path with its magnificent views of Bideford Bay down to Clovelly. Cobbled streets and pretty cottages, an absolute delight.
